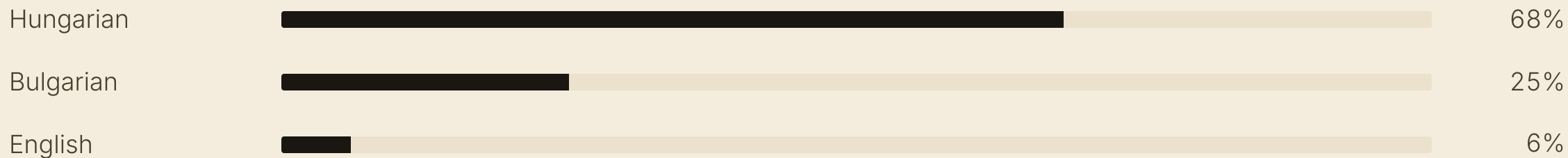

LANGUAGES SPOKEN

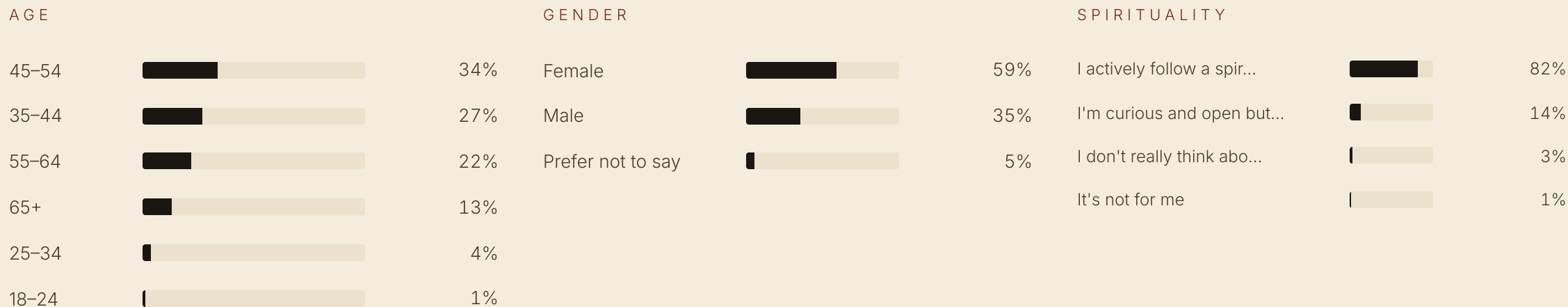
Three languages, *identical* reception.



Hungarian, Bulgarian, English. Viewers answered in their own language — the survey was translated, but the responses below cluster the same way regardless of where they were written.

AUDIENCE PROFILE

Mid-life, contemplative, *cinophile-leaning*.



83% are 35–64. 82% actively follow a spiritual or contemplative practice — this isn't a casual sample.

First impressions, recommendation, and emotional response.

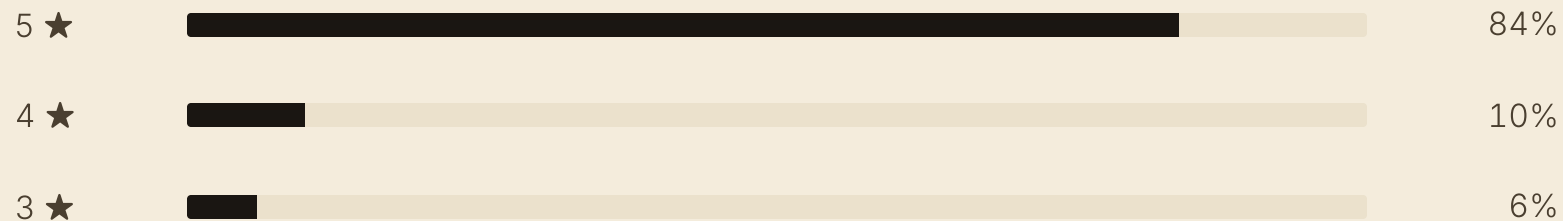
ENJOYMENT

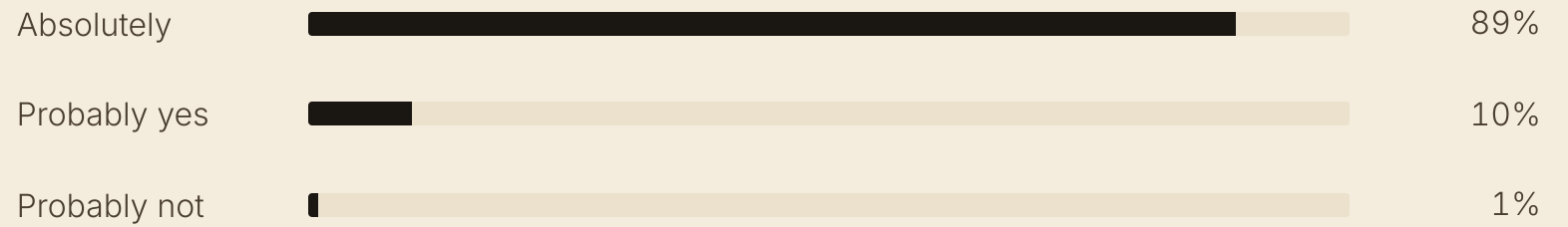

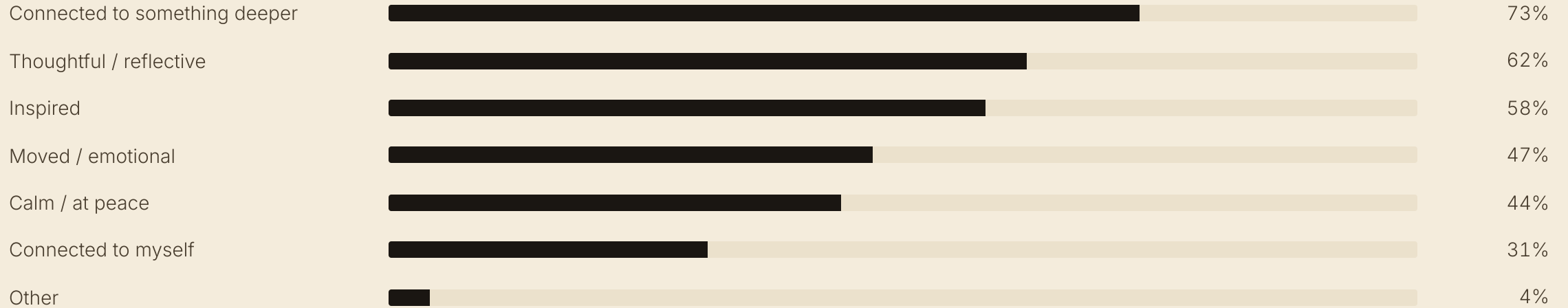

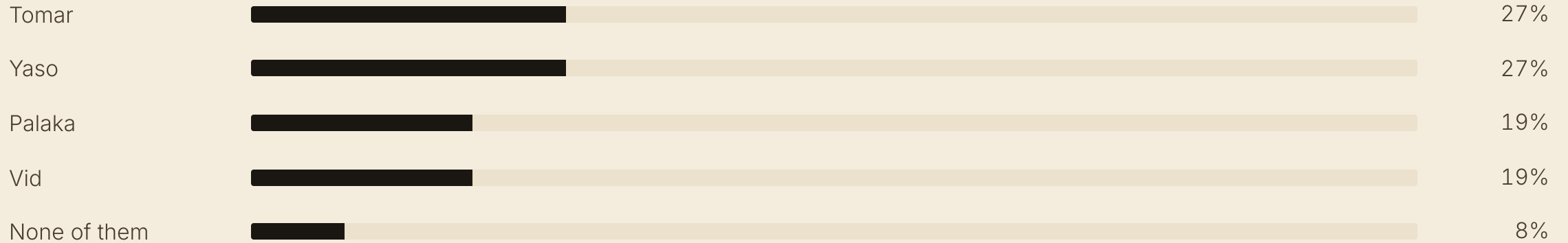

The film

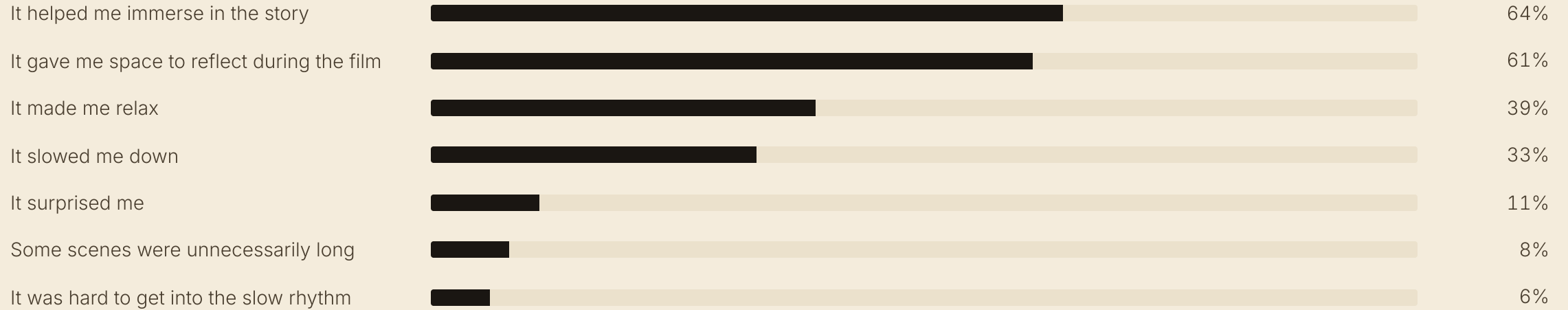
Character connection, pacing, and craft scores.

Even split across the three students — *universal entry.*



No single character dominates — three of the four register at 27/27/19% — which means a distributor can lead with any one of them in marketing without losing the rest.

Immersion and reflection, *not slowness.*



Eight craft dimensions, *all above 4.7 / 5.*

Meaning & message

What they took away — intellectually, emotionally, and as a film.

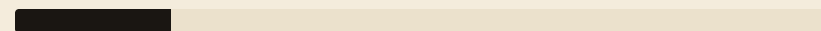
Three quarters experienced the film *both emotionally and intellectually.*

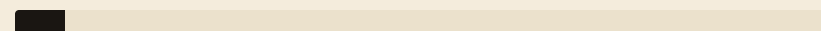

What they took *away*.

Two parallel messages came through with equal weight: that life is a spiritual path worth living seriously, and that walking it without a guide is essentially impossible.

Life as a spiritual path to live, not possess 7 MENTIONS

Many viewers heard the film as a call to treat life itself as a meaningful, lived practice.

“Life is a beautiful but difficult path worth taking seriously.”

The master is indispensable 7 MENTIONS

An equally strong cluster: a teacher / guide is not optional on this path.

“Following a master is not easy. But without a master, life is impossible.”

— English respondent

Many paths, one summit 4 MENTIONS

Several respondents took away that there isn't one correct path — different temperaments reach the same truth.

“The film shows how three different human types reach the same summit through their own inner struggles — and at the end all three receive their reward.”

— Hungarian respondent

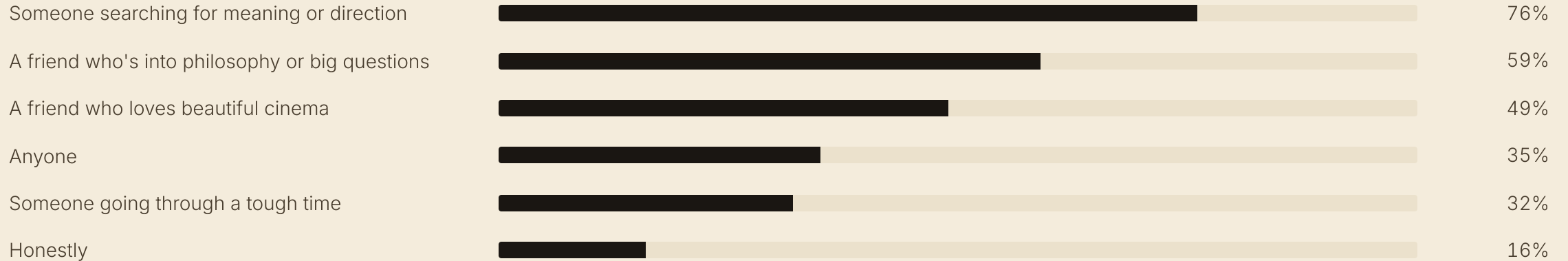

Audience reach

Who they'd recommend it to, and how they'd watch it again.

WOULD RECOMMEND TO · 37 RESPONSES

Seekers and cinephiles — clear core, clear adjacencies.



76% would recommend to someone searching for meaning or direction — wellness, contemplative, and festival channels map directly to this audience.

WHY ACQUIRE NOW

Three reasons to *buy*.

I

The audience already loves it.

4.77/5 enjoyment, 99% recommend, eight craft scores above 4.6 — before any festival run.

II

The audience is reachable.

Mid-life cultured viewers with a defined contemplative interest. Bookable through wellness, festival, and arthouse channels.

III

The film travels.

Identical reception across three languages. Bulgaria + Turkey locations open festival hooks across Europe and the Mediterranean.
